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Charlottesville, VA — The Charlottesville-UVA-Albemarle Emergency Communications Center (CUA911) is pleased to announce its award of a three-year accreditation by the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) through its Agency Training Program Accreditation (APTA) process, an initiative of Project 33®. This national recognition affirms the agency's commitment to excellence in training and professional development for 9-1-1 telecommunicators.

The APTA designation reflects the high-quality, consistent, and standards-based training CUA911 provides to its emergency communications personnel. The rigorous review process evaluates an agency's training materials, instruction, oversight, and quality assurance practices to ensure alignment with APCO's American National Standards (ANS) for public safety communications.

CUA911 was recognized at the Food for Thought Luncheon at APCO's 91st Annual Conference and Expo in Baltimore, MD, on July 30, 2025.

The accreditation is effective through 2028.
